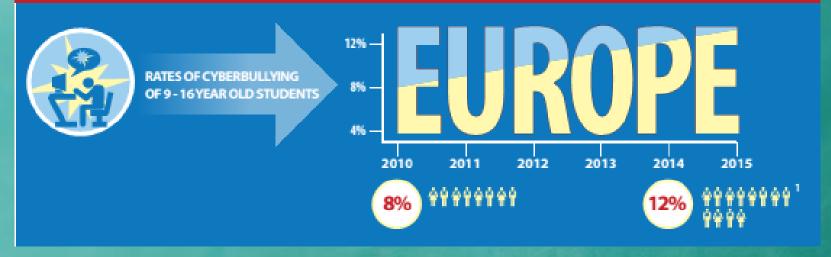

THE PRESIDENT INITIATED AMENDMENTS TO LAW

- the CONCEPT of bullying and cyberbullying;
- OBLIGATES each SCHOOL to carry out at least one long-term program for the prevention of violence;
- all forms of VIOLENCE against any member of the school community are PROHIBITED;
- principle is INFORMED about every case of violence;
- in the case of bullying a RESPONSE PROCEDURE, an order of decisions, and the forms of assistance are initiated;
- psychological ASSISTANCE for a child and parents;
- psychological ASSISTANCE for a teacher;
- each STUDENT should develop social and emotional COMPETENCES;
- teachers improve QUALIFICATIONS;

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE MINISTRY

SET UP AN EFFECTIVE, SPECIFIC SYSTEM FOR PREVENTING VIOLENCE AND BULLYING IN SCHOOLS:

- Responsibilities;
- Values
- Norms of behaviour
- Regulation of prevention;
- Development of positive environment;

RESPONSIBILITIES OF EMPLOYEES:

- Engagement of students and parents;
- Participation in community activities;

RESPONSIBILITIES ARE UNDERTAKEN BY MUNICIPALITIES AND NATIONAL BODIES:

- Monitoring and coordination of prevention programmes;
- Allocation of financial and human resources;
- Non-formal education;
- Public communication;



EDUCATIONAL, HEALTH AND SOCIAL ASSITANCE

- Provision of educational and social ASSISTANCE needed for children and their parents;
- ONE-STOP-SHOP Inter-institutional coordinator, whose office in each municipality is being set up;
- FINANCED by three ministries EQUALLY;

- develop LIFE-SKILLS TRAINING;
- schools MUST DO MORE to foster an environment of safety, tolerance and respect for children and teachers
